## Secretary's Report – 25<sup>th</sup> April 2020

Well what a strange time we are having with everywhere locked down and the country basically at a standstill. At least the farming industry is still continuing albeit in different conditions.

I thought I would write a short report to keep you all updated with what is happening within the Society. As you know we were supposed to have a Council meeting this coming Saturday followed by the AGM which have been cancelled. It is hoped to hold the planned Council meeting on July 25<sup>th</sup> and follow that with the AGM. This obviously depends on the situation with Covid-19 and Government recommendations.

The office continues to function as usual. It is refreshing to have phone calls from members about a wide range of things from AI recommendations and semen purchase to bull availability, cattle sales and general advice. I have been ringing members as well to see how things are and to generally keep in touch during these strange and difficult times. Voting papers for membership onto Council are steadily coming in with about 60 returned so far, it's interesting though that not many are from existing Council members!

I thought I would do my usual Secretary's report that I would have presented at the Council meeting and distribute to you so that you are keeping up to date with things as much as is possible.

There would have been five new members for election at the meeting, all registering. Unfortunately two long term members have died, Helen Wyles and Gordon Davidson. There have been 13 resignations, six of which were registering members who were no longer keeping cattle and seven students. There are at present 379 members, 376 this time last year. Since the last meeting I have sent out six information packs to persons enquiring about the Society.

Semen sales are steady with 50 straws being sold since the last meeting, however this does include eight straws for contract mating heifers in the Pochin herd.

No bulls have been inspected since the last meeting which isn't surprising, however there are several that require inspecting and registering as soon as possible when we are allowed to travel. There have only been 15 heifer registrations so far this year but that is to be expected.

Visits have been to say the least minimal, however before the lock down I did go to Wiltshire, Dorset and Somerset to view cattle that were to be entered at Melton Mowbray. Whilst that way I also visited other members and one new member. In total over the two days I went to eight farms. I also went to Norfolk to visit three farms who also wanted to enter cattle at Melton. Other than these no other visits have been made. It is going to be a very strange summer with no shows, field days or other events to go to. I hope I can soon get out and about again but time will tell.

Cattle sales are slowly picking up, particularly for bulls, the majority have been completed privately, albeit from input from myself and other Field Officers. There are several bunches of cattle, particularly heifers for sale. If you want any more information then please don't hesitate to contact me. Keep safe and well.

## Secretary's Report – 25<sup>th</sup> July 2020

There are 13 new members for election at this meeting, there are eight registering and three Associate and two Student members for election. There are at present 331 members which is well down as there have been 25 resignations since the last meeting and 38 students have been removed. I emailed all the students twice to ask if they wished to stay as members, one replied to say they wished to remain on the list, eight replied asking to be removed and I haven't heard from the others so they have been removed. I have been informed of five members dying, Gordon Davidson, Helen Wyles, Hazel Pocock, Sir Carron Greig and Yvonne Prescott. This means there are 206 Registering, 31 Registering Life, 75 Associate, 12 Junior/Student and 7 Overseas members.

Since the last meeting I have sent out 12 information packs to persons enquiring about the Society. A new project in Norfolk re-wilding an Estate could be very lucrative for us as they are very interested in purchasing about 30 Red Poll cows and calves however they will only take cattle from a TB4 area and want them all from one source.

Semen sales are steady with 124 straws being sold since the last meeting, including one member purchasing 20 Lavenham Sir Galahad and 25 Knepp Rambler and another purchasing 30 Knepp Rambler.

20 bulls have been inspected and registered this year, five by Joy Broughton, three by John Williams, two by Helen Arthan, one by Denis Jenkins with the remaining nine by myself. Point scores has averaged 166. 15 are M0 and 5 are M1.

Igenity Beef Profiles continue to be carried out on all bulls registered. Some interesting results are being seen which the Breeding Committee have had copies of, they will be discussing these when they meet up again. If anyone wants a copy of these then please let me know so that I can send them to you.

There have only been 103 heifer registrations so far this year but that is to be expected and seems to be becoming the norm of late with registrations coming in later in the year.

Due to the Covid-19 situation I haven't been to any shows and there haven't been any events to attend. I went ten weeks without going anywhere but I have started to go out and about again now and have been visiting members, inspecting bulls etc. in Nottinghamshire, Leicestershire, Norfolk, Suffolk, Essex and Cambridgeshire. The office has been busy though with phone call enquiries on a wide range of topics. I have tried to be in contact with as many members as possible, I don't know how many I have been in contact with but it will be the majority of active members, at least those who register cattle. Joy Broughton and myself spent a very interesting day judging the Photographic Competition. Thank you to Joy for printing out all the entries, it certainly made it a lot easier than looking on the screen.

Cattle sales have been steady with several bulls changing hands with several more hopefully in the pipeline. Female sales have been good with the majority of cattle on the website being sold.

There has been a good demand for steers from members who have their own butchery business.

There is nothing to report regarding Probationary Judges.

## Society Trophies

Just a note with regards to the Society trophies that were awarded for the National Show, the Herd Competitions and the Inter-College Competitions in 2019. As you will all be aware none of these events have taken place in 2020 therefore the trophies haven't been awarded. Can I please ask all of you who won the various trophies in 2019 to keep them safe for another year. It is hoped that things will return to some form of normality in 2021 and that the competitions will take place with the trophies once more being awarded. I have a list of every one who won each trophy, duly signed for by their recipients.
